

Searching for Content on the Site

There is a great deal of content on this site and a number of ways to find it.

1. If you are looking for *a specific page* on the site, try going to the [Site Map](#) page and looking through the list of featured pages. This page also has a full site map you can browse.
2. If you are looking for a *community psychologist*, use our [Member Directory](#). This is a listing of all SCRA members who chose to be listed. You can search by name, state, institution, or keyword such as specific skills or research interests. SCRA members who are available as consultants can include that information here.
3. If you are looking for *a document*, the chances are it is in a document library. The main [Document Library](#) includes every public document on the site. You can search using any word that might be in the title or description of the document for which you are looking.
4. The document library is quite large, so it might be faster to find out if a specific, smaller document library on the site might hold what you are looking for. These smaller document libraries are all linked from the main Document Library page.
5. The Search function on the top right of each page is quite powerful. Just type in any keyword.
6. If you are looking for *a video*, you can find all of the videos submitted for the SCRA video contest [here](#). There are also a number of other videos displayed or referenced on the site, but there is no central listing of these. Almost all the videos on the site are posted on and linked from YouTube. Use the search terms “SCRA” and “community psychology” on YouTube to find relevant videos.
